

MEA is registered in British Colombia with the Private Career Training Institutes Agency (registration # 2563) and is accredited by Transport Canada and Industry Canada as an approved institute accredited to deliver marine training to meet national and international standards.




Courses offered at the range from entry

level training for new Deckhands seeking employment with domestic employers such as the British Columbia Ferry Services Corporation, Seaspan International and the Canadian Coast Guard. More advanced training up to certification as a Master (Captain) of a vessel is also offered for both the fishing and commercial fleets, as well as electronic navigation and radio training. The college recently completed a Survival Craft Training facility and a Shipboard Fire Training Simulator. These two facilities are one of only two in Western Canada.



Western Maritime Institute Student Accommodation

- Western Maritime Institute's students come from all over Western Canada and the Arctic The typical course at WMI run from one (1) day to three (3) weeks.
- Accommodation for classes of up to 16 students is required but is not available in the area.
- WMI proposes to build up to six (6) chalet style student residences.
- Each residence will house up to six (6) students in single study type cabins with shared facilities





- Development of the student residences will help to support and strengthen the local economy by:
 - Introducing visitors into the area who will utilize new and existing restaurants, retail and service sector businesses in the community as well as enhance the use of Nanaimo airport
 - Enhancing the local employment opportunities.
 - maintaining the use of building in there historical roll and an educational institute.
- A Maritime College respects the needs of future generation to qualify for employment in the marine transport sector of the province. Marine Transportation is one of the vibrant areas of the economy where there is significant demand for qualified personnel.
- Western Maritime Institute recognizes their commitment to environmental stewardship in all aspects of their operations.
- WMI in sitting the proposed student accommodation we will maintain the rural nature of the property.
- WMI's proposed student residences are small, chalet style units. Careful sitting of the units in the wooded area on the north east corner of the property will only impact three or four of the tall trees on the site.
